Over the past 17 years, the FDLA Women's Fund has had many outstanding women join in a collective effort to continue that first vision of caring. Many long-lasting friendships have been made through Board and committee volunteerism, problem-solving and valuing each person's contribution.

The year 2020 will be etched in our memories forever. It has been a year of great challenge and apprehension for ourselves, our families and our nation. We've been reminded how critical it is to have close, positive relationships for our wellbeing and survival. We know more than ever, we cannot go it alone.

For the FDLA Women's Fund, 2020 marked the first time the Power of the Purse Luncheon was canceled. This was a significant decision, as this event raises 40% of the annual budget. This revenue loss has meant pivoting and addressing the most immediate issues.

The Board and the Executive Director stepped up and embraced this time of change. One of the first steps was to contact the four founders and invite them to contribute their ideas. Another step was to reconnect through a Zoom meeting with as many former Board members as possible.

- Retool ongoing components of Phase I of Fond du Lac Says No More initiative related to awareness-building and education through Project Table Talk and Green Dot Bystander Intervention Training sessions conducted virtually
- Restart Phase II of FDL Says No More by holding focus groups of local men to discuss their solutions for ending domestic violence, sexual assault and child abuse countywide
- Expand work regarding diversity, equity and inclusion, focusing first on internal evaluation of our agency, while also pursuing partnerships focused on serving all women and girls equitably
- Strengthen collaboration with local grant recipients through continued funding of their projects/programming that supports our mission
- Explore how to become greater stakeholders in women's health issues, especially those linked to mental health and adverse childhood experiences (ACEs)

Looking back over the past 17 years of the outstanding work of the FDLA Women's Fund, I am proud to be part of the story of caring for women and girls. It is humbling to see one's dream come true.

Please join me in continuing this dream for the women and girls of Fond du Lac County!
